Kubrick's metaphoric, thought-provoking, grandiose, science-fiction landmark film, with space travel to Jupiter, the appearance of mysterious stone monuments, and the presence of the film's major character - a super-computer. A team of robotic-like astronauts Bowman (Dullea) and Poole (Lockwood), during a voyage to Jupiter are terrorized by the arrogant, humanistic, on-board computer HAL 9000. The mission fails, and Bowman is reborn within a divine embryo that floats in space.

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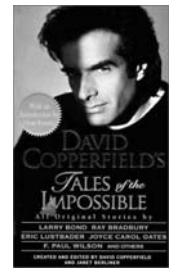

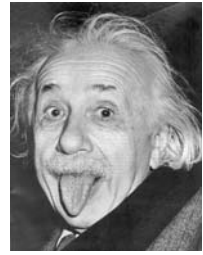
